## Minutes February Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6:00pm by Vice President Steve Oliver. The past secretary was not in attendance and the last meeting was October, so approval of the minutes was waived.

Treasurer Virginia Lackey gave the treasurer's report. We have \$5959.73 currently in our checking account. Virginia announced that dues were due, and 3 members, including returning member, Tom Mier, paid dues.

Tana McClay reported on T Shirts for the 2018 car show. She and Debbie Rife have chosen the color, light ash gray, and indicated that last year's Best of Show winner will be on the back of the shirt along with the names of our sponsors. The new Timber Cruisers logo will be on the front. Tana hopes to have some shirts available in time for the Walla Walla Wine Car Show.

Concern was raised as to the location of our road signs for the car show. Larry Shoemaker still has them in his possession. Don Kelly said he would call Larry to determine if any repairs need to be done on the signs, or replacements.

Discussion followed in regard to availability of metal plaques for our car club name to put in our cars and ordering new metallic door signs for parades and car shows. Debbie Rife had ordered the metallic car sign from Vista Print on-line. She can give her account information to anyone wanting to place an order. It has been a long time since we had the smaller metal plaques. Perhaps we can ask Arlan when he returns from their trip to see if he knows where they came from.

The question came up as to when and where we will hold our Friday night Cruise-ins. Lucy Parker said that she had received a call from the people who have the manufactured home sales lot opposite WalMart offering their lot for our cruise-ins. Cindy was going to follow up to see just what they had available – restrooms, storage for the Barbecue and refrigeration facilities for our perishable supplies. Also considered was returning to the Texaco station, but something would have to be done about our food having continuous source of refrigeration, and not being taken by employees. Another option was the lot where The Other Guy's car lot is, but we have no information as to what facilities would be available. Cruise-ins usually start about the end of May when the weather warms up.

Dixie Lund brought up the subject of members no longer active, and missed. Carolyn Bloyed expressed an interest in coming back if she could be in charge of activities. Whitmores and Grays seemed to prefer a quieter club without the emphasis on a car show, and Bozarth's no longer have a car. Dixie was going to give Carolyn Bloyed a call. Club members were encouraged to invite people they come across that are car enthusiasts to invite them to a meeting.

Upcoming car shows: We received an invitation from Salem to attend the Oregon State Penitentiary Car and Bike Show on July 14<sup>th</sup>. We don't have a date yet for the wine car show in Walla Walla. That group is looking for a new winery to host the show.
